# Supplies available from the apiary

There is a stock of frames, foundation and jars at the apiary which are available for purchase every Tuesday morning and on Saturdays when there is a New Beekeepers' practical session. The stock of jars is rapidly decreasing and won't be topped up until lat July. Check with Eric McLaughlin if you wish to visit.

#### All frames and foundation are for National hives

DN4 - Deep National Hoffman frames - £1.35 each 10 frames - £13.50

11 frames - £14.85

Standard brood foundation - £1.30 per sheet

SN1 Shallow National frames - £1.00 each

10 frames - £10.00 11 frames - £11.00

Super foundation - 80p per sheet

SN1 frames are straight sided and will need plastic/metal spacers

**Apiinvert.** Syrup ready to feed bees. Unlike sugar solution it requires no mixing, more readily accepted and less work required for the bees to invert (not wasting energy), more close to a natural food.

## 13kg 1 - 4 boxes £24 each, 5 + boxes £23 each

**Apifonda.** If you are venturing on a Queen rearing project this fondant is what you need. Very similar to Apiinvert, it is a paste not a liquid. If a colony becomes light through the course of the winter a dollop of fondant could well be the difference between life and death of the bees.

## 1 x 2.5 Kg bag £5.00, 1 box 12.5 Kg £25, 2 + boxes £24 each

The Apiinvert can be fed as a 'gee up' in the spring, emergency feeding during the 'June gap' and of course at the end of the season when preparing for winter.

Sadly Andrew Pugh, one of our long standing members, has passed away after a short illness. Andrew went through the Beginners' Course many years ago and kept his bees near his home at North Wootton. For a number of years we shared an apiary.

Andrew was from an engineering background and was always finding clever solutions to beekeeping problems. He was also a very proficient home carpenter and made most of his hives and equipment.

He was a keen Church bell-ringer and lay preacher, and we often rang together over

the years. He regularly worked on one of the Welsh narrow gauge railways that are run by enthusiasts, and his engineering skills were always in high demand. He was a man of many parts and lived life to the full.

Andrew found it hard to retire as his skill set was particularly important to the firm that he worked for, updating the safety systems for nuclear power stations was one of the projects that he told me about. He was eventually able to retire and continued to enjoy life to the full. He and his wife Flo were keen gardeners.

Our thoughts go out to Andrew's widow Flo, and their sons and daughter. The funeral will be at North Wootton Church at noon on Tuesday July 4<sup>th</sup>.

## Giving up beekeeping & selling up

When I started beekeeping 15 years ago I was soon made aware of a lady beekeeper who lives quite close to, who has lefty a lasting impression. She is seen as the authority on skep making and held annual skep making days for many years. She was a constant at the Bath & West Show where she would sit quietly in the middle of the Bees & Hon-



ey Tent making skeps for 4 days. Eventually the skep making days became a little too much, and the Bath & West slot was handed over to a South East Division member.

We used to take bees down to Exmoor for the heather honey, and I'll never forget this lady running up the hills, and everywhere in fact. As is the case for all of us eventually, Diana Robertson has decided it is time to hang up her smoker and hand her 4 colonies of bees over to a younger beekeeper who will look after them. She will extract the honey at the beginning of August and place the supers back above the crown boards, so that they can be cleaned up by the bees. They will be ready to move in mid to late August. Whoever buys them will have healthy colonies to take into winter, and full colonies with young queens to kick start the 2024 season.

#### New Leaf Award 2023



For the last couple of years, Somerset Beekeepers' Association has been the extremely fortunate recipient of significant donations from New Leaf Life Design. New Leaf is the company run by Becky Wright, offering help with workplace wellbeing. Becky has a strong commitment to the World around us, and as a part of her commitment, gives a proportion of her income to Somerset Beekeepers' Association so that a new beekeeper who might otherwise find it difficult to start along this road, is able to do so.

This year's recipient is Adam Bacon who is part of a fruit and vegetable growing co-operative near Barton St David. The co-operative's mission is to supply organically grown produce to the local market, with as low a carbon footprint as possible. To enhance this goal, Adam and the rest of the team intend to produce good pure honey for the local market as well. Setting up isn't cheap, as we all know, and so the New Leaf Award has provided a colony of bees and a hive. You can't manage bees without protective clothing and some essential hardware, so Adam is also receiving a BBWear bee-suit, a smoker and a hive tool.

The hive and bees were delivered on Sunday June 25<sup>th</sup>. Stewart Gould and Adam installed the bees in the new hive while Becky looked on from a distance, although one ungrateful bee did manage to find her.

It might be a little late to ensure a harvest this year, but at least they will be set up to get off to a flying start next season.

As Becky's generosity has been so fulsome this year, e were also able to supply a new hive and colony of bees to Ben Bullard of Pylle, and a new hive to Harry Hawkins of central Division.
