Spring - but not quite

Diving down to Taunton with Joe King a few days ago, I was delighted to see hedgerows bursting with blackthorn (prunus spinosa) in bloom. Blackthorn is an excellent early source of pollen and can be a useful source of nectar too, provided the weather is warm enough, but just as it came into bloom this year we were hit by a cold snap. Fingers crossed.

It should soon be joined by other *prunus* family members, like wild cherry *(prunus avium),* wild plum and some varieties of bullace.

Meanwhile, my bees are making do with the winter flowering honeysuckle (lonicera fragrantissima). Roll on the fields of dandelions.

New Beekeepers' Course

We've come to the end of this year's theory sessions, with most of the six meetings very well attended. We started with 44 potential new beekeepers, but have sadly shed 2 along the way.

The practical sessions will be starting on Saturday April 15th and will continue through the summer, at our apiary. We will, of course, be asking for demonstrators to help with these sessions. Don't be shy, just email me at <u>somertonbees@btinternet.com</u>. You don't need to be super-experienced. Remember that nearly all of our new beekeepers will nt have been near a beehive as yet. To start with they need to be shown how and why we open hives, and to familiarise themselves with handling bees in large numbers.


From the Chairman

Apiinvert. Syrup ready to feed bees. Unlike sugar solution it requires no mixing, more readily accepted and less work required for the bees to invert (not wasting energy), more close to a natural food.

13kg 1 - 4 boxes £24 each, 5 + boxes £23 each

Apifonda. If you are venturing on a Queen rearing project this fondant is what you need. Very similar to Apiinvert, it is a paste not a liquid. If a colony becomes light through the course of the winter a dollop of fondant could well be the difference between life and death of the bees.

1 x 2.5 Kg bag £5.00, 1 box 12.5 Kg £25, 2 + boxes £24 each

The Apiinvert can be fed as a 'gee up' in the spring, emergency feeding during the 'June gap' and of course at the end of the season when preparing for winter.

The View from the Divisional Apiary.

Although things have not changed very much from last month in the Apiary. It is very obvious that spring is around the corner and that the active beekeeping season will soon be upon us.



The snowdrops that we have planted are

looking good and the first daffodils will soon be out, The buds on our trees are beginning to swell, and the cowslips promise to be as good as last year. Every two weeks we heft the hives and top up any fondant that is needed. Now is the moment that hives starve when they run out of stores, just before the spring flow. If you have any doubts, now, is the time to put on fondant to bolster their reserves. Because of the cold the bees are unlikely to be able to take down syrup yet, fondant is the supplement of choice.

We are turning to various tasks to improve the access to the apiary. The five bar gate has begun to sag and will be re-hung. We will also be laying some surfacing in the run up to the hives, which will radically improve access for mobility scooters and wheel chairs.

Now is the time to ask yourself "Do I have the correct extra equipment ready? Will I have the equipment ready if I have a swarm? Is all my equipment cleaned and sterilised ready for the new season? Don't get caught out, it is very easy!

Soon we will be going back to weekly inspection of the bees, all of you are very welcome to come and join in on a Tuesday morning for some good company and to do all the work that is appropriate for the season. We look forward to seeing you.

The Basic Assessment

If you've been keeping bees for a year then now is the time to consider taking the BBKA Basic Assessment. It's pretty much like a driving test. The one big difference being that the Assessor actually wants you to pass the 'Basic'. They will actively guide you toward the right answer, while ensuring you know it.

It's very much a practical assessment, with conversation and no written work at all. It could be conducted at your apiary, but more likely at the divisional one.

You can apply now by contacting the Somerset Exams secretary at bridget_knutson@yahoo.co.uk. Assessments are carried out in the summer by which time anybody who started last year, will have kept bees for the minimum required period. We will try to run some coaching sessions closer to the time, but for now, have a glance at the syllabus. The link is below. It may look a bit daunting, but it is stuff you already know.
